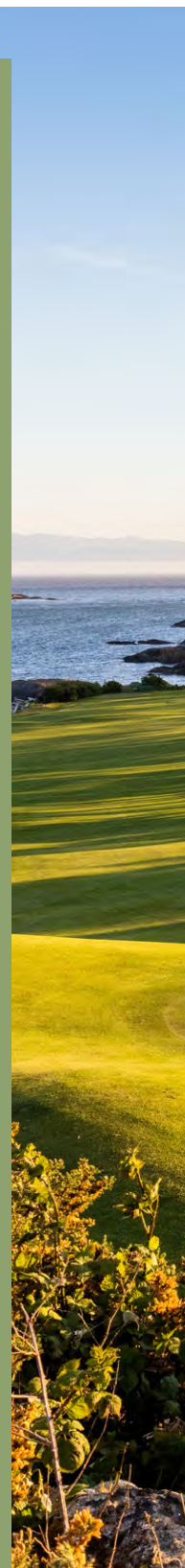

Members with playing restrictions **cannot** join groups playing on days/times when they themselves are restricted from playing.

PLAYING RESTRICTIONS

WAIT LIST	Waitlist Members may play 1 round per week and one additional round during a Women's or Men's Day. They do not have lottery privileges and must wait to add their names to any time until the lottery has been published. They must also pay a waitlist green fee each time they play.
NON-RESIDENT	May play 6 free rounds and must pay a green fee for any additional rounds.
ASSOCIATE	May play 12 free rounds and up to 8 additional paid rounds. Maximum of 20 rounds per year.
JUNIOR EAGLE	Must be accompanied by an adult golfing member. May graduate early through the Junior Launch Program (11 and under).
INTERMEDIATES	Intermediate members, who are restricted in certain times on Fri - Sun may add themselves to an open time during those restricted times if there is an opening after 3pm the day prior.

JUNIORS

Juniors with a single-digit handicap may play during restricted tee times if booked on the same day at the invitation of an adult member. On the day of, the Pro Shop may approve Juniors to play outside restricted times when the tee sheet is quiet and the times would go unused. During the Winter golf season, Junior restrictions will be moved forward to allow play as of 1pm daily.

EARLY MORNING GOLF

From May to September there will be early morning golf allowed on Mondays and Sundays. Members will be allowed to tee off between 5:00 am - 5:30 am. To reserve a spot they must contact the Head Pro (lindsay@victoriagolf.com) at least 24 hours in advance. Members must have their own clubs with them as the Back Shop will not be open and they will not have access to power carts or power caddies.

GOLFERS PER GROUP

SINGLES

During prime time of 7:00 am to 2:00 pm, singles are not to be booked. On the day of play, a single may play in an open time, but can be moved or joined with other groups to maximize use of the tee sheet at the discretion of the Pro Shop/Starter. When playing as a single, you should not assume that other groups will allow you to play through if they are keeping pace.

TWOSOMES

During prime time of 7:00 am to 2:00 pm, twosomes may be paired by the Pro Shop / Starter with other singles or twosomes if they deem the pairing is for the betterment of the tee sheet and pace of play.

FIVESOMES

The tee sheet is setup to allow groups of four. A fifth player may be added at the discretion of the Head Professional to enable maximum use of the tee sheet.

Being a fivesome does not change the Pace of Play Policy - any group falling out of position will be asked to immediately move back into position (skip holes) and/or form a threesome and twosome if there is space to do so on the course.

Fivesomes will be permitted during the winter golfing season in order to maximize Member access to the tee sheet.

No Shows: Please be aware that the Club has recently adopted a policy for no shows. The detailed policy is on page 16 of this document. [Click here](#) to see it.

LOTTERY | GROUP BOOKINGS

GENERAL TEE TIME LOTTERY RULES

Lottery is run 3 days in advance.

Members may make requests up to 10 days in advance.

Groups with more Members are given priority over groups that have guests in them.

Larger groups may request up to 4 tee times back-to-back, but single requests are given higher priority.

Our software uses a lottery points system to allocate tee times. Points are given based on rounds played in the 14 days prior to the lottery, and group points are an average of all members in the group.

MEN'S NIGHT RESTRICTION

Official Men's Day times are from 11:00 am until 4:00 pm on Wednesdays. Men may bring 2 guests to any Men's Night (3 at the discretion of the Pro Shop, depending on availability).

WOMEN'S DAY RESTRICTION

Official Women's Day times are from 8:30 am until 11:00 am on Tuesdays. Women may bring up to 3 guests during any non-event days.

During the winter months, if there is not an official event taking place, Women's Day and Men's Night tee times that aren't used may be booked by anyone 24 hours in advance.

Members wishing to book multiple rounds on the same day can only do so if the second tee time is booked no earlier than 24 hours prior. Priority must be given to offering fair access to Members trying to book their first time on that day. These circumstances must be approved by a member of the Professional Staff.

Visitors must be members of other private clubs and have a verified handicap

Local guests may play a maximum of once per month and no more than 6 times per calendar year

If there are open times the day of play, Members may move their time earlier or add a guest by calling the Pro Shop

Non-resident guests may play more than once per month, but no more than 6 times per year

Twilight is approximately 4.5 hours before sunset, time is set weekly by the Pro Shop

VISITING RECIPROCAL GROUPS:

Reciprocal members from our formal reciprocal clubs have access to book times at VGC through their Club's Head Professional. Depending on the wording in our agreement with them, they may have access to book times that are restricted to other guests. If you see a reciprocal group playing at VGC, please make them feel welcome at our Club as their 'home away from home' for the day.

For Members wanting to use a cart for a few holes, they will be charged \$1.50 per hole with a minimum \$6 charge.

POWER CART CONTRACTS

We offer monthly power cart contracts for those Members who take a cart on a regular basis or who need to take carts for medical reasons. The below rates are available on a monthly or yearly basis.

MONTHLY RATES

October - March | \$160
April - September | \$235

MEDICAL CART REGULATIONS

On days that the Links Team deems the course too wet for full cart access, they may allow limited access to medical cart users. To be considered eligible to a medical cart, you must have a valid medical issue that would prevent you from playing golf that day unless by the aid of a power cart.

CLUB STORAGE & OTHER FEES

POWER CADDIE STORAGE = \$360/ year (billed annually in June or \$30/month). This is a high demand service and availability is limited. Please see Thomas Trask in the backshop to add your name to the wait list for a stall. (\$260/year if you store your cart but don't charge your battery)

CLUB STORAGE = \$192/ year (billed annually in November or \$16/month). This is a complementary service for full active and senior members. Members in other categories may store their clubs if there is a vacant stall, but should be expected to pay for this service.

ON COURSE SAFETY

The golf course and practice areas at the Club are very intimate in nature and there are many areas that are in close proximity to one another. Our goal is to provide a fun and safe environment to use the facilities despite the inherent risks associated with playing golf.

Keep in mind that you are responsible for any shot that you hit and therefore need to adhere to the following guidelines when you are using the golf facilities.

Please also remember that the Club has insurance for broken windows. If you hit an errant shot and may have broken a window, please report to the Pro Shop.

DRIVING RANGE

Our Driving Range is limited to shots of 150 yards or less. If you hit a ball into the range while playing the 1st or 17th holes, ring the buzzer on either side of the range and ensure players have stopped hitting range balls.

Players warming up on the driving range must stop hitting balls when they hear the buzzer and may only resume when the area is clear.

PLAYING ADJACENT HOLES

As a general rule, the group that is further ahead on the course always has the right of way. When playing holes that are close together, please always give way to any players that are farther along the course than you.

Ex: players on the 4th hole should always play and clear the area before players on the 3rd hole hit. Players on the 17th hole should play and clear the fairway before players on the 16th hole hit.

FORE

Please yell “fore” whenever you hit a shot that is travelling towards another golfer, or towards an area where there may be other golfers or pedestrians.

ON COURSE SAFETY - CONT'D

BLIND SHOTS

Hole 6 and 15 have blind tee shots and hole 6 has a semi blind approach. When playing the 6th hole, please leave someone at the top of the hill until you have cleared the fairway. Please ring the bell when you have cleared the green. On the 6th fairway and 15th tee there are periscopes to check if the group ahead has cleared the area of play. There is also a live webcam of the 6th fairway and 10th green for players hitting from 6 tee (the link is on our website). Please remember that the pin may be left in while putting and a group may still be on the green.

SHORT GAME PRACTICE AREA

When in transit to and from the practice area, please be mindful of players teeing off the 15th hole. Players playing the 15th hole have the right of way over players in transit to the practice areas.

CROSSING HOLES

Several times during the round, groups have to cut across another hole. Please wave groups across when it is safe to do so. (10 to 11 crosses over 6, 17 to 18 crosses over 1, 18 to Clubhouse crosses over 1).

LINKS TEAM SAFETY

The Links team have the right of way on course until 10:30 am daily. Play cannot commence past hole 11 prior to 9:15 am.

If you run into a Links team member, wait until they see you and wave you up before hitting. If they don't wave you up, be patient and let them finish their task before playing.

ON COURSE ETIQUETTE

BALL MARKS

Fix all ball marks in order to maintain the health and integrity of our putting surfaces.

DIVOTS

Have a sand bottle with you when you play and fill any divots made with sand and smooth them over with your foot. Please note that divots made on par 3 tees do not need to be filled as the Links team will sand those tees on a regular basis.

BUNKER RAKING

If you find yourself in a bunker, rake the entire area that you affect while in the sand. All footprints and club impact areas must be smoothed out and raked to ensure the playing surface is returned to normal for the players following you on the course. When you finish raking, place the rake with the rake head in the bunker (pointed to the middle of the bunker) with the rake handle placed out of the bunker on the grass bank.

LETTING FASTER GROUPS PLAY THROUGH

It is good etiquette to let faster groups play through at a convenient point in time. If you have a clear hole in front of you, and the group behind you is waiting on you, you should let them play through.

ON COURSE ETIQUETTE - CONT'D

POWER AND PULL CART TRAFFIC FLAG PROGRAM

During the Winter golf season, follow the WHITE FLAG PROGRAM - Flags point toward the preferred direction for **ALL** traffic (left or right), and **PLEASE** stay outside the flag area with **ALL** traffic

PULL CARTS

Take Pull Carts around the outside of any green side bunkers to avoid wear and tear to the fringe areas around the greens. Pull carts should also not be taken directly onto tees, but should be left to the side of tees.

POWER CARTS

Power carts should be driven in the fairways whenever possible and should never be taken within 30 feet of greens or tees. Around the greens, power carts must obey the cart traffic flags and be taken to the left or right of the greens as indicated. The onboard GPS system in each cart will prevent carts from accessing areas that they should not be in.

MUSIC

Music should not be played at a volume that other groups can hear it. If you are playing music and another group can hear it, you must turn it down or turn it off.

The natural environment around the course is part of the enjoyment of playing here, your music cannot negatively affect another groups golf experience.

GENERAL INFORMATION

SMOKING/VAPING

You may smoke while on the golf course. Smoking is prohibited while using the driving range and in other practice areas when there are other Members present. When smoking around the clubhouse, you are reminded that you must be 7 m from any entrance way, and not in an area where service is provided. Dispose of butts or nicotine pouches in an appropriate receptacle.

CHILDREN

At VGC, we are very proud to be known as a family-friendly club. However, parents and caregivers are reminded that they are responsible for their children at all times while on site. When in the restaurant or when using any of the practice facilities, children under the age of 12 must be accompanied and in the line of sight of their adult at all times.

CELL PHONE USE

Cell phones are restricted to non-verbal forms of use when in and around the clubhouse and while on the course. If you need to make a phone call, you may use your cell phone while standing next to a house phone or in the parking lot. House phones are located near the front desk area and in the Locker Rooms.

WASHROOM CODES

The washroom codes are 4-3-2-1 for both the Men's and Women's washrooms. Washrooms are located between the 3rd and 4th holes and at the 11th tee box.

PACE OF PLAY POLICY

The first hour of tee times each day should play in less than 3 hours 45 minutes.

After the first hour of play, the pace of play for the course is 4 hours.

If a group finishes in over 4 hours and is more than 15 minutes behind the group in front of them, they are deemed to have broken the Pace of Play Policy and will receive a written notice from the Match Committee as an awareness protocol.

Repeat offenders of the Pace of Play Policy will have their playing privileges restricted in accordance with the penalties below.

SLOW PLAY PENALTIES

After each documented slow time, the group involved will receive an email from the Club.

3rd, 4th and 5th slow play time documented = 1 week prohibition playing before 2 pm.

6 or more slow play times documented = 1 month prohibition playing before 2 pm.

NO SHOW POLICY

Purpose – To inform Members of their responsibilities and sanctions regarding booked tee times.

Rationale – Tee times are a valuable commodity and are much in demand. Members of Victoria Golf Club like to play golf and if a tee time goes unused it could mean that another Member is missing out on a golf game.

Background –

1. Members can ballot for tee times 4 to 10 days in advance.
2. Tee times are confirmed and Members informed via email 3 days in advance.
3. Members may remove their name from a ballot by telephoning the Pro Shop.
4. Members may remove their name from a confirmed tee time online up to one hour prior, or by telephoning the Pro Shop.

Summary – Members who have booked tee times (or had them booked for them) are expected to tee off at that time or remove their name from the tee sheet prior. There are consequences for Members who repeatedly do not remove their name and do not show up for their booked tee time. A Member who will be late and intends to join their group on the course, must inform the Pro Shop or will be subject to the No Show Policy.

NO SHOW PENALTIES

Members who do not remove their name from the Tee Sheet prior to their tee time and who do not show up for their tee time (No Show) will receive a notice via email from the Match Committee.

3rd, 4th and 5th no show time documented = 1 week prohibition playing before 2 pm.

6 or more no show times documented = 1 month prohibition playing before 2 pm.

FROST POLICY



If the temperature is warm overnight and there is no danger of frost, tee times will commence as soon as it is light enough to accommodate golf.

If the temperature is very cold overnight and frost develops prior to the first tee time, the Links team will determine if a 10 am modified shotgun start is necessary. Temporary green will potentially be used if the ground is still frozen, frost-covered or thawing.

If the event of a very heavy frost, the Links team has the option of moving to a 12 pm shotgun start. Tee times falling after 12 pm will be automatically moved into the shotgun and members with tee times before 12pm can phone the Pro Shop to add themselves into a starting hole if they wish to play golf that day.

If the temperature is borderline overnight, the Links team will wait as long as they can to make the call. there will be no delay of any kind, but early groups may have to play to temporary greens until the links crew determines the greens are fit for play.

During frost delays, groups should designate one player to contact the Pro Shop to combat tying up Clubhouse phone lines and allow for efficient information flow to all Members.

PRACTICE FACILITY USE

SIMULATOR

May be booked for Member use in 30-minute increments on the day of use. The simulator may not be booked before the day of use. All bookings require a staff introduction to the area if it is their first time using the facility.

SHORT GAME PRACTICE AREA

May be reserved in 45 minute increments through the Pro Shop. May be reserved 3 days in advance.

DRIVING RANGE

Opens 30 minutes before the first tee time and closes at 7 pm in the Summer months. The range may open late on Mondays and Thursdays, and close early on Wednesday or Sundays due to maintenance. Daily range hours are posted outside the Back Shop.

ON COURSE PRACTICE

Practice on the golf course may only happen during non-peak times and must be restricted to only a few balls. Extra shots into greens should not be of a distance that will cause ball marks or damage to the putting surface. Practice shots should not be taken from the fairway that will cause divots. Extra shots off the tee should only be taken on holes where there are no other groups around. Players practising while on the course should never hold up a group behind them and need to let faster players play through.

DRESS CODE | ON-COURSE

Tailored pants, shorts, skirts or skorts are all acceptable. The minimum length for shorts, skirts or skorts is mid-thigh (mid-way between hip bone and knee).

Men's "Polo-style" golf shirts must be tucked in. Button-up shirts may be worn untucked provided they are evenly finished around the hem and designed to be worn untucked.

Women's leggings/tights are appropriate, providing they are worn in conjunction with a dress, skirt, or skorts. This includes yoga-style tights.

Women may wear a sleeveless shirt if it has a collar. Men's shirts must have a collar.

Appropriate golf footwear must be worn on the course.

Logos should be discreet and golf-related.

Hats must be worn facing forward.

Juniors and children may wear non-golf-specific clothing while on the practice areas or during Junior lessons, provided they are dressed in a way that is appropriate. They are required to follow the dress code if they are playing golf on the course.

Members are responsible for their guests' dress.

Blue jeans, garments with exterior cargo pockets if they are bulging or gusseted, tennis, track, gym, or yoga styled pants or athletic shorts, halter tops, tank tops (no midriff showing) are not permitted.

Any tattered, over-worn or faded clothing is also considered inappropriate.

Sandals, flip-flops or bare feet are not permitted.

Dress socks are not permitted when wearing shorts.



DRESS CODE | CLUBHOUSE

Appropriate golf, sports, casual or semi-formal attire are all acceptable in the Clubhouse.

Men's shirts are to be tucked in at the waist, unless designed to be worn untucked.

Logos should be discreet and golf-related.

Jeans are appropriate in the Clubhouse, but they cannot be frayed, dirty or ripped. Dress jeans may be worn throughout the Clubhouse, unless a different dress code is specified for a special event.

No headwear is permitted on the upper floor of the Clubhouse or in the serviced areas, with the exception of formal men's and women's hats.

Athletic wear is acceptable in the locker rooms while participating in athletic events, or in the casual dining areas during breakfast hours.

Leather flip-flops are acceptable throughout the Clubhouse. Rubber flip-flops are unacceptable unless designed to be a dress sandal.

As a Member of VGC, it is your responsibility to know the dress code and to ensure that you and your guests are dressed appropriately at the Club. The intent of our dress code is to respect the history and tradition of the game of golf while navigating the current trends in golf fashion.

Thank you for taking the time to be up-to-date with the current dress code in the Clubhouse and on the course.

RECIPROCAL BOOKING PROCEDURES

One of the privileges of belonging to a premium club like VGC is the opportunity to have access to other excellent courses all over the world.

VGC Members do not necessarily have full access to these other clubs, therefore should always consider themselves guests while at other facilities.

Members must request to book reciprocal tee times ahead of time through Richard Ingle (richard@victoriagolf.com) or Lindsay Bernakevitch (lindsay@victoriagolf.com).
